Primates Africa was started by a number of NGO's and individuals involved with the care of primates in November 2005. There is a desperate need to preserve our South African primates in the wild, as their current death rate in urban and agricultural areas is increasing at an alarming rate. Our main concern is the welfare of the urban and rural primates as primates are adequately conserved in national game parks by government supported conservation agencies. Councils also control vast natural areas – these enjoying very little management and protection by and large – they, too, need our assistance.

Primates Africa aims to do 2 things:

- Provide a forum where primate organizations and individuals can support each other and network amongst each other to more efficiently protect the rights and welfare of primates
- Use volunteers to provide a community service while simultaneously assisting in primate conservation in the following areas:
 1. Providing a 'Monkey hotline' to assist callers who require information about living with primates or who report injured primates - no: 08 44 32 99 74.
 2. Rescue network – volunteers are trained to assist with rescuing injured or orphaned primates
 3. Veterinary and ICU care for injured primates
 4. Education – in schools by offering talks to children and developing educational material
 - Counseling people who have problems with primates
 - Dropping brochures in 'hot' areas
 - Advising on management of primates when required
 - Educational talks for interest groups
 - Writing regular articles in magazines and newspapers about primates
 - Educational literature for various cultural groups
 5. Participating in the Environmental Impact Assessments and advising on improved planning during the development stage to reduce human/animal problems later.
 6. Assisting in research on benefits of primates, behaviour modification methods and population dynamics.

It is hoped that Primates Africa will soon be able to establish a specialized primate sanctuary and rehabilitation centre in KZN to cater for the many primates removed from the wild due to injury, capture or being orphaned.

Volunteers offer their time at no charge, but we require funding for medical costs, telephone costs, printing, transport, food, building of enclosures to operate the community service. Additional funding is required for the establishment of a primate sanctuary/rehabilitation centre in KZN and the maintenance thereof.

We rely entirely on commerce and individuals for funding. We rely on members of the public to assist with our services. Our success is in your hands - we rely entirely on you!
